

On Saturday, June 10, the Low XII Chapter of the Widows Sons Motorcycle Club hosted a ride-in to benefit The Maine Children's Home.

The riders brought more than \$2,000 in new <u>Christmas Program</u> donations, and participated in a BBQ celebration that will benefit the the <u>Friends</u>. The Low XII riders raised \$820, which will be matched by a Bank of America grant. The result was \$1,640 more for <u>camp scholarships!</u>

## Healthy Northern Kennebec Mini-Grant

On Monday, June 26, The <u>Sharon Abrams Teen Parent School</u> <u>Program</u>/Waterville Alternative Ed and <u>The Children's Place Early Care & Education Center</u> were recognized by Healthy Northern Kennebec as the recipient of a mini-grant to extend their Gardening Project collaboration.

Besides tending the existing eight raised-bed gardens, goals of the gardening project include:

- Continuing the mentorship between the teens and the preschoolers
- Extending the growing season with the purchase and installation of an outdoor greenhouse

- · Increasing food security for at-risk youth
- Conservation of natural resources, sustainable practice, composting and recycling
- Providing educational opportunities for the teens and preschoolers to learn about gardening, health & nutrition, and preserving foods

Children are more likely to try vegetables they have grown themselves, therefore gardening can effectively transform attitudes about food choices. And, when these gardeners take their new food preferences home, they can improve their family's food choices, leading to healthier lifestyle habits.
