In January, Allison participated in the KVAC Cheering Championship with the Waterville High School cheering team, coming in sixth overall and advancing to the regionals. The cheering team was also honored with the Jamie Beth Shible Award for most improved team. Allison and her team then competed at the Regional Cheering Competition in Bangor on January 28 and placed seventh overall, missing advancing to states by only $\frac{1}{2}$ of a point.

Literacy at The Children's Place


What was your favorite book as a child - *Goodnight Moon?* *Pat the Bunny?* *The Very Hungry Caterpillar?*

What about a song - *Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star?* *The Itsy Bitsy Spider?* *Head and Shoulders, Knees & Toes?*

We know that literacy begins at birth. As an infant hears sounds, responds to gestures and tunes in to the oral language from his/her responsive adults, the baby's growing brain is stimulated. Reading

books is a perfect tool to help with this brain stimulation. Reading with infants and young children not only strengthens the foundation for developing literacy skills (supporting school readiness), but is also a good start toward a lifelong love of reading.

[The Children's Place Early Care & Education Center](#) recently held a family literacy night. Families joined their infants, toddlers and preschoolers in their classrooms to explore activities focused on favorite children's books. The evening was a resounding success!
