Special Recognition

Twice in the past six years, the Nancy Marshall Communications Team has done extra targeted outreach to local media when Christmas supplies were getting very low. This led to new articles in the Morning Sentinel, the Kennebec Journal and the Portland Press Herald. TV stations started calling to arrange for interviews. This led to a number of significant local gifts of more than \$43,000. There were 111 new on-line donations totaling \$15,197. The toys, clothing and books began pouring through the front door. 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
